

Donation Criteria

The Habitat for Humanity of Wake County ReStore accepts donations of good, usable, structurally-sound building materials. All donations are tax-deductible to the full extent allowed by law. Please follow the general guidelines below. If you're unsure if your donation meets this criteria, please call 744-2420. Donation criteria list is subject to change.

Appliances

Must be 5 years old or newer, with all knobs

Dish washers
Gas and electric ovens (*no double or microwave*)
Range hoods
Range tops
Refrigerators
Washers/Dryers (*no gas dryers*)

Architectural Items

Antique items
Columns
Mantels
Porch Posts

Cabinetry

In good condition with intact doors and drawers
Full kitchen and bathroom sets
Individual pieces
Counter tops, straight sections, no holes, no laminate
Hardware

Doors, residential only

Entryway units
Exterior or interior, no rot, cracks, or missing panes
Pre-hung or door slabs, no taller than 84"

Flooring

Hardwood/Parquet flooring, 25 sq. ft. or more
New carpet 10'x10' or larger
New padding
New vinyl tiles or vinyl sheets
Slate/Marble and ceramic tile

Furniture

No office or upholstered furniture
Good condition and structurally sound
Bedroom furniture (*no mattresses*)
Book shelves, case goods
Tables and chairs

Hardware

Complete sets of door hardware
Any quantity of hinges, nails, screws, hangers, etc.

Lighting

Fixtures and ceiling fans in good condition, complete and in working order. No fluorescent lights or can lights

Lumber and Sheetrock

Dimensional, 6' or longer
Trim and moulding, 6' or longer
Sheetrock and plywood, 4' x 8' or larger
No scrap lumber, no nails, no concrete on wood

Miscellaneous

Garden tools in working order
Hand tools and power tools, in working order
HVAC units, 5 years old or newer
Shutters
Water heaters, 5 years old or newer

Paint and Wall Coverings

Latex paint only, full, unopened and non-rusted
Wallpaper, borders, tools and glue

Plumbing

Bathtubs, fiberglass, claw-foot, steel, *space permitting*
Faucets, complete sets only
Sinks, kitchen and bath, pedestal, without rust or cracks
Shower enclosures, no cracks or stains
Toilets, residential only
Miscellaneous plumbing hardware, fittings, pipes

Windows

Double Hung, Picture, Bay, complete, without rot, cracks, or foggy glass. *No sashes, singlepane or storm windows.*

Items not accepted at the ReStore

<i>No Commercial items</i>	Molded materials
Anti-freeze or motor oil	Office furniture
Can Lights	Oil-based products
Cast iron tubs/sinks	Opened cans of paint
Double ovens	Regulated fluids
Electronics, TVs, monitors	Sashes or Storm Windows
Fireplace inserts	Shower doors
Garage doors	Single pane windows
Hard-wired fluorescent lights	Sliding glass doors
Hazardous materials	Solvents or strippers
Lumber under 6 feet	Thermostats
Microwave ovens	Upholstered furniture
Mirrors or glass	Used formica countertops

How to Donate to the ReStore

Follow signs to the donation dock in back of the building. Staff and volunteers will be on hand to help unload your items and provide a receipt for your tax-deductible donation. Donations can be dropped-off at the ReStore until 1/2 hour before store closing. Businesses, please call beforehand, so that we will have sufficient staff available to assist you.

The Habitat for Humanity of Wake County ReStore sells new and used building materials to the public at discounted prices. Shoppers find lumber, plumbing fixtures, lighting, flooring, hardwood furniture, windows, doors, cabinets, tile, blinds, shutters, appliances and more - all in a new **50,000 sq. ft. warehouse.**

The ReStore collects new and used (tax-deductible) building materials from community donors and Habitat's DeConstruction program. The DeCon program salvages building materials and interesting architectural items *by hand* from residences being remodeled or demolished. Crews can reuse or recycle up to 85% of a house's building materials - providing unique inventory for your home improvement projects.

All ReStore proceeds support the building of new Habitat homes in our community. If that's not motivation enough to shop, consider the ReStore diverted over 2,000 tons of usable materials from local landfills last year. Habitat Wake supports neighbors in need of affordable housing and encourages all of us to be good stewards of our environment. Come shop, save, donate and deduct, and support Habitat for Humanity.

Benefits for you, the community and Habitat homeowners:

- Receive a tax-deduction for your donated building materials (contact your tax preparer for details)
- Avoid commercial tipping fees
- Conserve landfill space
- Support Habitat home construction; all sales of new and used building materials at the ReStore support the Habitat mission

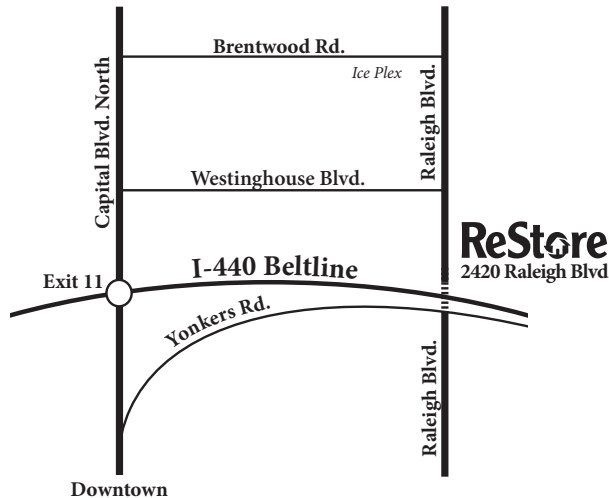
