PROGRAM COST

\$1,300 USD (Approx.) (Does not include airfare, required visas or immunizations.) The program cost includes accommodations, meals, in-country transportation and medical insurance. Participants will pay their own transportation to Lilongwe (flight information will be forwarded to all participants.)

ITINERARY

Saturday: Travel from North America.

Sunday: Arrive and welcome in Lilongwe.

Monday: Orientation.

Tuesday-Thursday Meet the ZOE children in Madisi and help build homes each day.

Friday: Celebration and home dedication.

Saturday: Goodbyes. Fly home or travel to the safari location.

Sunday: Safari day!

Monday-Tuesday: Remaining participants travel home.

ACCOMODATIONS AND MEALS

Our team will stay in a hotel in Madisi with two to four people per room. Breakfast is served at the hotel, lunch is eaten on the work site, and dinner is taken at a variety of local restaurants.

TASKS ON THE WORK SITE

Your team will be guided by skilled masons to build a safe, decent house from the foundation. Typical work includes mixing mortar and concrete, carrying construction materials, fixing chicken wires, digging foundations, making bricks and carrying water.
