



About Habitat for Humanity Cambodia




Since 2003, **Habitat for Humanity Cambodia** has helped more than

Tithe Contribution Drive Impact


The Total Tithe Fund transferred to Habitat Cambodia FY21-Feb, FY25

The impact of the Tithe Fund, FY21 to FY25

I. Overall impacted

- Directly funded 27 projects
- FY25 funding 6 projects
- Tithe Fund contributed to the National Office's Operations Resource Mobilization, Program Delivery and Management.

II. Sustainable organization development & stability impacted

- Allows flexibility in funding new initiatives & partnerships consistent with HFHC's strategic framework.
- Built and maintain the MEAL system and Strengthening
- Org capacity building (Program Management, Resource Mobilization Skills, MEAL, Higher Grounds, and Complements GV's activities.
- Other Program Innovation and Advocacy Works

III. Research and evidence for policy advocacy and resource mobilization impacted

- **Conducted impact assessment:** FOI Strengthening (Gender Assessment, Housing Impacts, PASSA, Passive Cooling System)
- **Conducted research:** Housing Eco-System Assessment (HEA), Challenges on People-Public-Private Partnership (P4),
- **Coordination and networking:** NGO Housing Network in Cambodia, led by HFH-C and UN-Habitat
- **Advocacy:** The Challenges of Housing and Land Policy Advocacy, and Overview of Urban Housing for Low-Income Families in Cambodia. Organized National Housing Forum and dialogue, and forums with housing actors with government, CSOs, and private sectors regularly



The impact of the Tithe Fund, FY21 to FY25 (Cont')

IV. Influencing policy implementation impacted

- Promoted transformative change in cities and human settlements through knowledge, policy advice, technical assistance, and collaborative action to leave no one and no place behind
- Advocated to sub-national governments to unlock land for social housing, including **2.1 ha in Siem Reap** and **0.5 Ha in Battambang**. Land compensation was provided to 61 families in informal settlements in Battambang and 75 families in Siem Reap, along with their respective communities.
- Advocated to integrate housing into the National Social Protection Policy Framework 2024-2035

V. Innovative Programming/ Approach impacted


- Implemented the MAATCH Project is a physical shelter intervention and advocacy initiative through matching \$ for \$
- Implemented the Cash Transfer Project and developed the SoP
- Advocated for the government to leverage its funds through contributing land and infrastructure, and on the social housing project, USD 3.5 M
- Established the Social Water Enterprise model, which is to improve access to safe drinking water


VI. Total Construction's Tithe support to the total organization's construction
