What is Habitat Wake?

Seeking to put God's love into action, Habitat for Humanity of Wake County brings people together to build homes, communities, and hope. Habitat Wake is an affiliate of Habitat for Humanity which formed in 1976, operates in 70 countries and has served approximately 40 million families. Habitat Wake was formed in 1985. Habitat Johnston County was formed in 1991 and merged with Habitat Wake in 2018. Since 1985, Habitat Wake has built more than 900 new homes and served nearly 2,000 families with new construction, home preservation and global building in Wake and Johnston Counties. With your help in FY24, we will build 35 new homes, preserve 70 homes, and help many more families through our advocacy efforts in Wake and Johnston counties. Habitat Wake tithes on its unrestricted income to fund the construction of Habitat homes in our partner countries: [Honduras, Malawi, and Cambodia](#). **Habitat Wake's homes aren't given away:** program participants complete sweat equity hours, take financial education courses, and purchase their homes by paying an affordable monthly mortgage.

What is a Faith Coalition?

Habitat Wake works with more than 120 congregations throughout Wake and Johnston Counties. We have organized these congregations into various coalitions so they can work together to strengthen relationships and build beloved community while serving families in need of affordable housing. There are denominational coalitions, geographic coalitions, and affinity coalitions. Each coalition has a web page with the build packet, volunteer Hub link, photo album and additional resources. We are working with the [Cary](#), [East Wake](#) and [Episcopal](#) faith coalitions on this build.

What is the Spring Flower's Place Build?

The Spring Flower's Place Build brings together the Cary, East Wake and Episcopal faith coalitions to build and advocate for affordable housing. The Spring Flower's Place Build provides the opportunity for congregations to share God's love with several families this year. We will build three new homes and help to finish other homes underway in the Flower's Place neighborhood in Knightdale. We will also advance Habitat Wake's advocacy campaigns during this build: approval of the Affordable Knightdale Plan and establishment of the Affordable Housing Acquisition Fund for Wake County.

Build Details

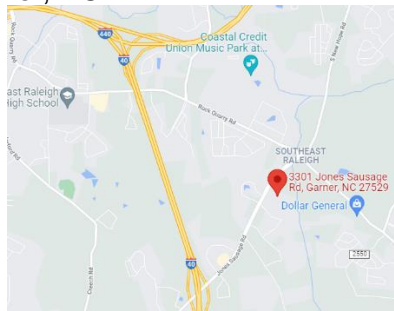
Day One

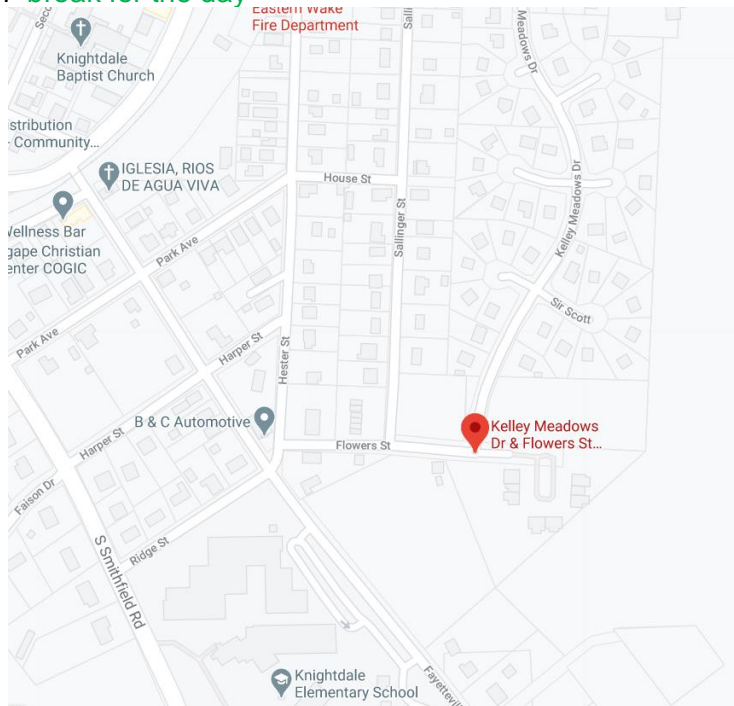
- Our warehouse entrance is in the back where the red circle is. You will see a blue Habitat for Humanity sign over the roll-up door.



Follow signs for volunteer parking. Volunteers will park either at the side of the building in the parking spaces parallel to Jones Sausage or in the back along the left side near the trees.

Flower's Place Neighborhood & Workday Logistics

- **LOCATION:** 24 Kelley Meadows Drive, in Knightdale.
 - We will primarily be working on three homes (see map above) that are close to each other and helping to finish as many homes as possible throughout the Flower's Place neighborhood.
- **PARKING:** You can park in the grassy area at the front of the property, which will eventually hold houses.
- **WORKDAY**
 - 8:15am – We start with a **Habichat**.
 - 8:30am – Habitat Wake's construction team will **divide the volunteers** to work on specific homes. The Spring Flower's Place name will be called out and volunteers will be sent to work on the homes that most need help on that day.
 - 11:15am – **Lunch is set up** and ready to go.
 - 11:30am – 12Noon – **Lunch break** (Spring Flower's Place vol gather at one location)
 - 12Noon – **back to work!**
 - 3:30pm- **break for the day**

Lunches

- The Spring FLP congregations will provide lunch for the Spring FLP volunteers. You are not expected to feed all volunteers on site.
 - The number of lunches needed is outlined on the schedule above.
 - It's possible that a couple of churches will work together to provide lunch on any given Saturday.
 - When bringing lunch, please provide all the items needed: paper plates, napkins serving, and eating utensils.
 - Please have lunch set up and ready to go by 11:15am. Lunch break is from 11:30am – 12Noon.

Funding the Spring Flower's Place build

- If you have not already provided your funds for your last build, please provide those funds at this time.
- Currently, it costs \$180,000 to build a home. That breaks down to approximately \$50,000 for the land and \$130,000 for materials and subcontracting.
- We invite each coalition to raise \$65,000 each year for their build.
- Historically, we have asked each contributing church to contribute \$6,500.
- Some churches give more, some churches give less.
- **What is God calling your church to contribute?**
- We would appreciate receiving your financial support at the beginning of the build, if possible, and before the end of the build.

Partner Families

- Habitat Wake has numerous families working on their sweat equity requirements that you will interact with during this build.
- We invite you to interact with the homebuyers on the building site and pray for them throughout this process.

Advocacy Details

WHY advocate for affordable housing

1. Wake and Johnston Counties are facing an affordable housing crisis:
 - One in four families lack affordable housing.
 - There is a 28,000-unit affordable housing deficit for families in Wake County earning less than \$50,000 a year.
2. Habitat Wake is thrilled to build 35 new and preserve 70 existing affordable houses this year in Wake and Johnston Counties.
3. Yet, we must do more. Advocating for affordable housing enables us to serve additional families in this crisis.

HOW to use your voice to advocate (Proverbs 31:8)

1. Learn about becoming an [Advocacy Ambassador](#).
2. Join us on **Monday, February 5th** to advocate for the [draft Affordable Knightdale Plan](#). The town is hosting an Open House, and we want to have as many people as possible come out in support of the plan. Stay tuned for information about the virtual prep session and the time and location of the Open House
3. Help to create an **Affordable Housing Acquisition Fund for Wake County**. As land values have risen, it has become increasingly difficult for non-profit affordable housing organizations, like Habitat Wake, to acquire land for the purpose of providing affordable housing to residents. Additional acquisition funds could also support unique preservation scenarios, such as preventing displacement of residents living in manufactured housing communities. Join us in encouraging the County to secure more preservation funding for a wider array of projects through an acquisition fund.

 - Racially discriminatory housing policies of the past have led to much of the racial inequality that is plaguing our country.
 - Black Americans have less than 20% of the wealth of white Americans, largely due to the lack of equity in their homes.
 - Average per capita wealth is \$338K for white Americans, compared to \$60K for Black Americans.
 - There is also a homeownership gap. Around 44% of Black Americans own their own home compared to around 73% of white Americans.

WHAT has advocating for affordable housing achieved?

Faith partners have been helpful in the passage of the following:

- \$80M Raleigh Affordable housing bond (2021-2026)
- Apex and Wake Forest's first Affordable Housing Plan
- Affordable housing zoning requests in Cary, Apex and Holly Springs
- Wake County and City of Raleigh
 - An additional \$61M allocated for affordable housing in 2023 enabling over 4,000 additional families to be served over the next few years with repairs, crisis housing assistance and homeownership assistance.
- Faith partners have used their connections with their local municipality to secure property for Habitat Wake: 5 lots in Wendell

Generate homebuyer applications:

- One in 4 people in Wake and Johnston counties lack affordable housing. This means that they are paying more than 30% of their income for housing thus reducing funds for food, childcare, health care and education.
- More than likely, there are people in your congregation that need affordable housing and may qualify for a Habitat home.
- Habitat Wake homebuyers earn at least \$41,000 a year and typically earn between 50%-80% of the Area Median Income (AMI) in Wake and Johnston counties (You can't earn more than \$90,650 for a family of 4).
- Typical Habitat homebuyers are nurse's and teacher's assistants, first responders, and other public servants that can't afford this area's rising housing costs.

Next Steps for Your Congregation:

1. Inform your appropriate outreach and congregational leaders about the build opportunities.
2. Identify a Habitat coordinator to lead the Habitat efforts at the congregation, if not already in place.
3. Secure funding for this year's projects. if not already done.
