Join Habitat Wake's 2018 Honduras Trip.

Travel with a mission team to La Ceiba, Honduras, February 3-11 to build new homes!

Join Habitat Wake and Habitat for Humanity Honduras for this special global build and help bring strength, stability and independence to families in need of a decent place to live. As you build a home with a Honduran family, you'll be welcomed into the community. You'll eat traditional food and meet the neighbors whose lives you're helping to improve.

Enjoy a hands-on building project, experience the area like an insider and share the trip with a team of likeminded volunteers. No experience is required!

After six years of work in Santa Rose de Copan, this is Habitat Wake's first visit to La Ceiba, the ecotourism capital of Honduras. Located on the northern Caribbean coast of Honduras, La Ceiba is the gateway to the Bay Islands of Honduras. Four national parks are within easy access: Pico Bonito and Nombre de Dios National Parks, the Cuero y Salado Wildlife Refuge and the Cayos Cochinos Marine Monument. The area is known for white water rafting and kayaking, as well as beautiful coastal views. La Ceiba is an ethnic melting pot, with Garifunas, Bay Islanders, Miskito natives, and many expatriates residing in the community. The Honduras headquarters of Standard Fruit Company (Dole) are in La Ceiba.

The 2018 Honduras Trip is being called the 360 Trip, honoring Habitat Wake President Kevin Campbell's threedecade tenure with Habitat and his 60th birthday in March. Kevin shares those three decade and 60 year milestones with wife Gayle Campbell, a human resources manager with Habitat for Humanity International. Our goal is for 30 members to join the 360 Trip Team.

Itinerary

Saturday: Arrive in Honduras. Enjoy your first dinner in-country as a team.

Sunday: Rain forest hike

Monday - Thursday: Build each day, 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m., with free time or team activities in the evenings.

Friday: Finish construction, then enjoy a dedication celebration with the community.

Saturday: Visit Cayos Cochinas fo island excursion

Sunday: Continue your travels in Honduras independently or depart for home.

Accomodations and Meals

Our team will stay in a hotel in La Ceiba with two to four people per room. Breakfast is served at the hotel, lunch is eaten on the work site, and dinners are at the hotel or at a variety of local restaurants.

Tasks on the Work Site

Typical work includes moving dirt and bricks, digging for septic tanks, bending rebar, mixing and pouring concrete, and laying block foundation. All tools and construction materials will be provided by Habitat Honduras, and a professional construction leader will guide each day's work.

Program Cost

Approximately \$1,250 USD, not including airfare. (flight information will be forwarded to all participants.) This cost includes accommodations, meals, in-country transportation, medical insurance as well as an important donation to Habitat for Humanity to help build safe, decent housing around the world. In addition, participants will pay their own air transportation to San Pedro Sula, Honduras.

Fundraise and Share Your Story

You may fundraise for your trip! Fundraising is as easy as telling your friends, family and co-workers about why you build with Habitat for Humanity. They may even ask to join the team! Habitat Wake staff will help you set you up a great website and guide you to success.

Volunteers are encouraged to set a fundraising goal over the minimum. Every donation you raise keeps Habitat building after your team returns home and helps us serve another family.
